# 18<sup>th</sup> Annual Mid American Indian Fellowships Gathering

#### New Location with Different Date and Schedule

## The 18<sup>th</sup> Annual Mid American Indian Fellowships Gathering is scheduled for Saturday, September 7, 2019 at Deer Run RV Park, 5055 NW Hwy. B, Appleton City, Missouri 64724.

While participants may arrive on Friday and camp on Friday night and/or Saturday night, scheduled gathering activities will happen only on Saturday beginning at 8 a.m. and winding up around midnight.

Activities will include indigenous crafts, games, auction, ceremonies, dance and a talking circle, as in previous years. There will be no more than one speaker at the gathering, with a talk tying in with some aspect of decolonization and/or cultural restoration, with most of the day and evening given to activities.

**Food:** There will be breaks for brunch and dinner. Rather than having a food team or food coordinators, people are asked to prepare and bring whatever foods they want – a simple potluck such as we have at fellowship meetings and ceremonies. Table service will be provided and washing stations set up with instructions for everyone to wash their own. Please bring reusable cups for coffee and/or water, etc.





Auction: Please consider bringing crafts, art, culturally relevant books, handmade articles, etc. to donate for auction. Proceeds help defray Gathering and other MAIF expenses.

**Deer Run RV Park is located on the North side of Hwy. B, 11 miles west of Osceola, Missouri and 27 miles east of Rich Hill, Missouri.** RV Camping is \$15 per night. Tent camping is \$10 per night. Those planning to camp should please contact the park directly. The phone number is (660) 598-2481. The address is 5055 NW Hwy. B, Appleton City, MO 64724. Be sure to let the park know you are coming for the Mid American Indian Fellowships Gathering. If we have a minimum of three campers, we get to use the clubhouse free of charge.

## Updated Statements of Purpose and Membership

Following more than a year of prayerful deliberation, the MAIF Council voted to amend Articles I and VIII of the Mid American Indian Fellowships Bylaws, these articles being the Purpose Statement and Statement of Membership. These two articles, as amended, are printed below:

**ARTICLE I.** Purposes (as amended by MAIF Council February 23, 2019)

- To promote and encourage harmonious relationship with Creator and Creation
- To serve as a bridge for colonized persons to re-enter and participate in indigenous Native American Indian community, culture and/or spirituality
- To promote healing/balancing of persons, peoples, cultures and land
- To promote and encourage reconciliation within and between persons, peoples, the Earth and all Creation and Creator

To promote Native American Indian cultural awareness and appreciation in both Native and Non-Native peoples through sharing of Native American Indian history, contemporary issues, arts, traditions and personal stories.

To promote, encourage and provide opportunities for active decolonization and indigenous cultural revitalization and restoration

To act as a network of indigenous spiritual groups.

#### ARTICLE VIII. Membership (as amended by MAIF Council February 23, 2019)

Membership in Mid American Indian Fellowships is open to those who desire to connect to, re-establish, increase their knowledge concerning and/or align their lives more directly to Native American Indian cultures and traditions. Membership in Mid American Indian Fellowships is actualized or brought into being in and through participation. Members participate; those who participate are members.

Susan Bates lived for many years at the Morningstar Grounds in Ozark County, Missouri where she served the people as Blue Holly Clan Mother. She was a writer, an herbalist and was known as a wise woman. She crossed over April 25, 2019 from complications arising from Myasthenia Gravis, a condition she lived with throughout much of her life. Her funeral was held at the Morningstar Grounds on May 26, 2019. It rained that day and was still raining as the people gathered. Then, as the funeral began, the rain abruptly stopped, and the sun came out.
